

CloudPost Privacy Document

Effective date: May 9, 2018 CloudPost Networks, Inc. (“CloudPost”) knows you care about how your Personal Information is used and shared, and we take your privacy seriously. Please read the following to learn more about our Privacy Policy.

By using or accessing CloudPost’s Website or by using any of CloudPost’s materials or services (the “CloudPost Services”) in any manner, you acknowledge that you accept the practices and policies outlined in this Privacy Policy, and you hereby consent that we may collect, use, and share your information in the following ways.

What does this Privacy Policy cover? This Privacy Policy covers our treatment of personally identifiable information (“Personal Information”) that we may gather when you are accessing or using our Website or the CloudPost Services, but not the practices of companies we don’t own or control, or people that we don’t manage. We gather various types of Personal Information from our users, as explained in more detail below, and we use this Personal Information internally in connection with our Website and the CloudPost Services, including to contact you, to fulfill your requests for certain products and services, to provide and improve the CloudPost Services, and to analyze how you use the Website. In certain cases, we may also share some Personal Information with third parties, but only as described below. We do not knowingly collect or solicit Personal Information from anyone under the age of 13. If you are under 13, please do not attempt to send any Personal Information about yourself to us. If we learn that we have collected Personal Information from a child under age 13, we will delete that information as quickly as possible. If you believe that a child under 13 may have provided us Personal Information, please contact us at dataprivacy@Cloudpostnetworks.com.

Will CloudPost ever change this Privacy Policy? We’re constantly trying to improve our Website and the CloudPost Services, so we may need to change this Privacy Policy from time to time. We will provide notice of any changes on the Website, by sending you an email, and/or by some other means. Please note that those legal notices will still govern your use of the Website, and you are still responsible for reading and understanding them even if you haven’t provided us with your email, or if you have told us you do not want to receive emails from us. If you use the Website or the CloudPost Services after any changes to the Privacy Policy have been posted, that means you agree to all the changes.

Information You Provide to Us: We may receive and store any information you knowingly provide to us, including information you post on our website and information in correspondence with us. For example, we may collect Personal Information such as your name and email address. Certain information may be required to take advantage of some of our features.

Information Received from Third Parties: We may receive information about You from third parties who have represented to us that they have the authority and the legal right to collect and provide us with that information. Those third parties may include customers of CloudPost with whom you have a relationship, and providers of information who may have collected your information through a separate relationship with You or from public records.

Information Collected Automatically Whenever you interact with our Website, we automatically receive and record information on our server logs from your browser or device, which may include your IP address, device identification, “cookie” information, the type of browser and/or device you’re using to

access our Website, and the page or feature you requested. “Cookies” are identifiers we transfer to your browser or device that allow us to recognize your browser or device and tell us how and when pages and features in our Website are visited and by how many people. You may be able to change the preferences on your browser or device to prevent or limit your device’s acceptance of cookies, but this may prevent you from taking advantage of some of the Website’s features. If you click on a link to a third-party website or service, such third party may also transmit cookies to you.

Again, this Privacy Policy does not cover the use of cookies by any third parties, and we aren’t responsible for their privacy policies and practices. In addition, if you use any CloudPost Services, we may collect information regarding your login, your account and data you may process using the CloudPost Services. When we collect the usage information described above, other than to provide support related passwords or login information which you receive for access to CloudPost Services which results from your failure to keep that information secure.

In addition, CloudPost uses the methods specified at www.Cloudpostnetworks.com/AboutUs/privacycenter. Although we believe those methods are adequate, you acknowledge that no security methods are perfect and that any transfer of information is at your own risk.

What Personal Information can I access? You may contact us at dataprivacy@Cloudpostnetworks.com to request deletion of any Personal Information we have. The information you can view, update, and delete may change as the Website changes.

Under California Civil Code Sections 1798.83-1798.84, California residents are entitled to ask us for a notice identifying the categories of Personal Information which we share with our affiliates and/or third parties for marketing purposes and providing contact information for such affiliates and/or third parties. What choices do I have? You can always opt not to disclose information to us, but keep in mind some information may be needed to take advantage of some of our special features or may be required by your relationship with one of CloudPost’s customers.

You have the right to request access to any Personal Information which CloudPost may have by contacting dataprivacy@Cloudpostnetworks.com. The information will be provided in a machine-readable format. You may also ask that we transfer the Personal Information to a third party, which we will do if technically feasible. You also have the right to review, add and update your Personal Information. You may also request the deletion of your Personal Information where:

- the Personal Information is no longer necessary in relation to the purposes for which it was collected or otherwise processed,
- you withdraw consent to CloudPost’s possession of the information on which the processing is based and where there is no other legal ground for CloudPost’s retention of the information,

- you object to CloudPost’s possession of the information and there is no overriding legitimate basis for the retention,
- the Personal Information has been unlawfully obtained or processed, or
- the Personal Information has to be erased for compliance with a legal obligation in the European Union or other law to which CloudPost is subject.

When you update information, however, we may maintain a copy of the unrevised information in our records. Some information may remain in our records after your deletion of such information from your account. We may use any aggregated data derived from or incorporating your Personal Information after you update or delete it, but not in a manner that would identify you personally. If CloudPost has your Personal Information because of your relationship with one of CloudPost’s customers, you should first contact that customer before contacting CloudPost.

Consent to Commercial Electronic Messages

If you provide us with an email address, You expressly consent to receiving Commercial Electronic Messages from CloudPost about your use of the Website, the CloudPost Services and our Products.

Upon receipt of your request, CloudPost will delete your personal data provided CloudPost may retain any data which is required for billing and accounting purposes or which is subject to legal retention requirements. In addition, if you discover any errors in data, you may contact us by emailing dataprivacy@Cloudpostnetworks.com and we will correct it.

Right to be informed of the appropriate safeguards where Personal Information is transferred to a third country or to an international organization If CloudPost has your Personal Information because of your relationship with one of CloudPost’s customers, you should first contact that customer before contacting CloudPost. CloudPost enters into agreements with its customers regarding the safeguards that have been put in place to protect your Personal Information for transfer outside of the European Economic Area.
